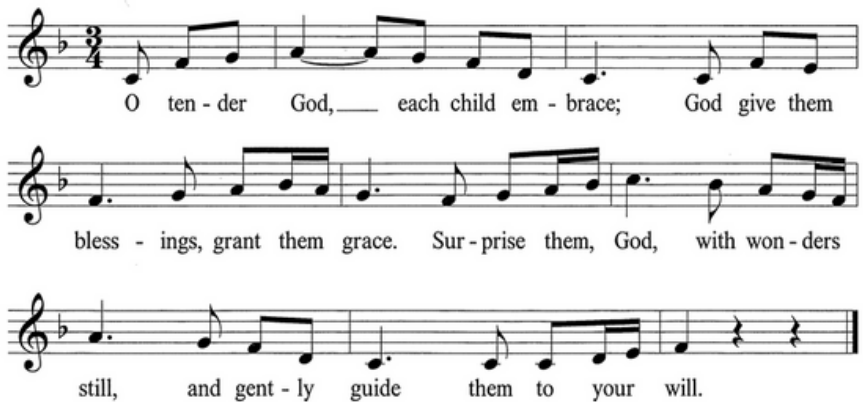

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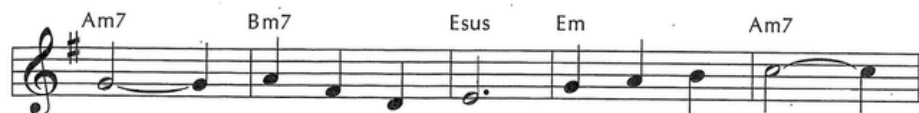

“Lord of the Dance” written by English composer Sydney Carter portrays the life of Jesus as a dance that invites all to join in. The lyrics are a narrative of the key events in Jesus’ life, exploring joy, death, resurrection, and the ongoing presence of Christ in our lives. Two verses describe events in this morning’s scripture reading, healing and the unbelief of the Pharisees. Carter’s intention was to create a hymn than resonates with the idea of Christ as a vibrant, living presence, inviting all to join in the dance of life. The music SIMPLE GIFTS, an American Shaker song adds to the rhythmic and uplifting nature.

Carter wrote “I see Christ as the incarnation of the piper who is calling us. He dances that shape and pattern which is at the heart of our reality.” Inspiration came from Jesus’ life, the English carol “Tomorrow Shall Be My Dancing Day” and a statue of the Hindu god Shiva in a dancing pose.

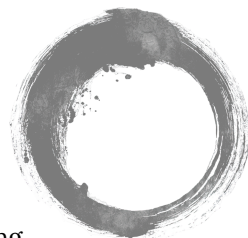
Centering Prayer

Expect contemplative silence, some video and in-person teaching, and companionship as we learn to pray together. No previous experience or study necessary.

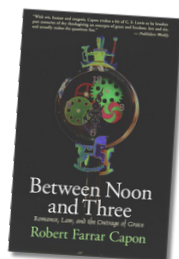




The Radical Grace of God

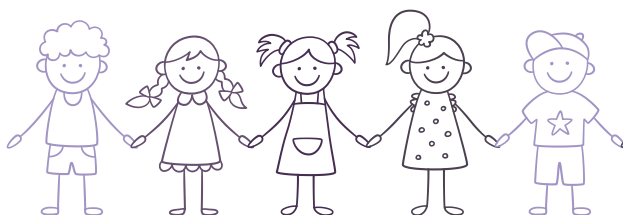

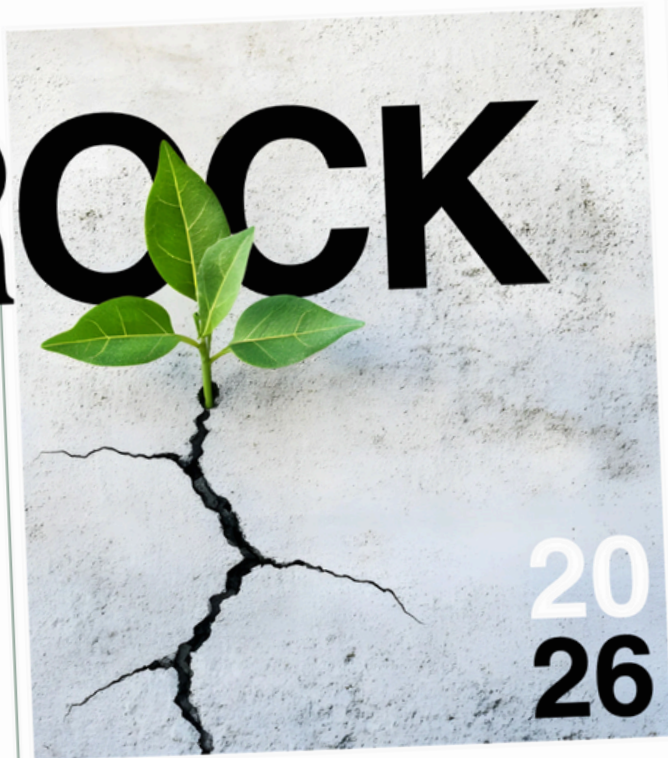
