

You can contribute to this emergency fund being organized through DCCF as a collective effort by making a donation here.






Pastors' Emergency Fund Poinsettias 2025

Drop off is available on Saturday, December 6 from 9-11am in the kitchen by the Mayflower Room OR Sunday, December 7 between 8:30 and 9am.


