
The History of Change at Plymouth Church

The History of Change at Plymouth Church presented by Plymouth Historian Susan McCarthy. Susan will review the significant changes made with the Plymouth Church structure, giving special attention to sanctuary changes. Time will be allotted for questions and comments.


Lenten Wednesdays at Plymouth Church


Expect contemplative silence, some video and in-person teaching, and companionship as we learn to pray together. No previous experience or study necessary.


